Budget Goals

Put forward a budget that addresses community needs

- Maintain all services as proposed in the adopted Board of Education Budget and the Town Proposed Budget
- Utilize funds available from current fiscal year to prepurchase items from next year's budget to reduce FY 21-22 spending
- Continued but reduced usage of the Unallocated General Fund to incorporate increases in expenditures from last year and shortages in revenue from grants this year

Meet Community Needs

- A main goal of the Town Council was to pass a budget that maintains current services and addresses known gaps in a fiscally responsible budget
- In order to do that we would have to:

- Recognize the increase would be a combination of expense increase from last budget and current expense increases
- Add needed resources to address known shortfalls
- Slowly walk down the utilization of the fund balance we used last year



Town Services

- The Town Council budget maintains all services as presented in the Board of Education approved budget and the Town Manager's proposed Town Budget
- Addition of a grant writer / project manager position and several new Board of Education positions
- No staff reductions

- No cuts in programs
 - Includes one community wide Bulky Waste pick up date in the fall



Approved Fiscal Year 21 – 22 Budget Expense Review

General Fund Information

- General Fund usage is a balancing entry
 - Expenses \$58,214,882

- Revenues \$57,754,882
- Fund Usage \$460,000
- The balancing entry is an assumption and changes with the variables of expenses and revenues throughout the year
- Less Expenses = less fund usage
- More Revenues = less fund usage



General Unassigned Fund Usage

- For the 20-21 fiscal year we originally planned to use \$500k of the fund
 - We then approved usage of \$400k for the fire truck purchase, \$284k for the BOE COVID fund, \$213k for the BOE 1% fund
 - Total planned usage: \$1,396,139
- For fiscal year 20-21 the town is anticipating spending \$226,589 less than planned (fewer expenses)
- We are estimating we will receive \$181,223 more in revenue than planned (more revenues)
- So instead of using \$1.4m as expected we will be using \$989k, \$408k less than planned

(1,396,139-226,589-181,223=988,327)

** Subject to change if we pre-purchase any items with 20-21 funds

Debt Plan

- The current budget reflects an increase of debt spending of \$50,000
- In 22-23 that spending will increase another \$50k

- Included in this plan is the slated increase for Birch Grove and \$5m for fire station renovations at stations140, 340 and 440
- The Debt will continue to increase for four years before it begins to drop down back to the current level in 2028



Stay the Course

This budget reflects the town's priorities

- Maintaining services, usage of end of year dollars to remediate increases and taking the residents into consideration
- We need to continue to be fiscally conservative to ensure we are saving where possible so we adapt to any changes that may come and make Tolland affordable for all 15k residents
- Based on the last BOE meeting there will be dollars available to add to the Town Council established COVID-19 fund for the Board of Education. This, along with the ESSR III funds will give the BOE maneuverability to adjust and meet the needs of our students
