Town Manager's Office – 860-871-3600

The Town Manager's Office has been busy working on several projects:

- Firehouse Project – reviewing bid documents and getting ready to send the project out to bid.
- Historic District Sidewalks – the Historical Landscape Architect has completed interviewing the Historic District Commission and the Commission on People with Disabilities to understand all needs. He will compile his recommendations for discussion at a joint meeting in June.
- Leslie Campolongo, Grants and Projects Manager, applied for several grants through Congressman Courtney's Office and we have been advised that two will move forward for consideration (Jail Museum ADA enhancements, Athletic Turf Field replacement).
- The Town Manager responded to several questions regarding the budget.

Human Resources

Tolland has several current vacancies: Assessment Technician, Firefighter/EMT and most recently Admin. Secretary II (Human Services). We anticipate moving along the recruitment process for all of these positions this month. Elise Johnson is leaving Town employment in her position of Admin. Secretary II (Human Services). We wish her well in the future.

Assessor – 860-871-3656

- The Office has once again posted the vacant Assessment Technician position. The position will be posted through the month of April in Town and through the Assessor's Association website. Former employee Debbie Grondin is working part-time hours through May to help keep the Office running smooth.
- The Board of Assessment Appeals met in April to hear appeals for the 2021 Grand List. The Board received 17 appeals and made reductions to 12 of them totaling \$322,640 in assessment reductions. This number includes 5 appeals for crumbling foundations that make up \$299,100 of the total.
- Per State Statute 12-63c the Assessor's Office sent Income and Expense questionnaires to Commercial and Industrial properties. The deadline to file without penalty is June 1st.
- The Office sent out applications for the Local Elderly Tax Relief Program and the State Homeowners Programs and has been processing them as they come in. The deadline to file is May 12th.
- The Assessor is working with Bob Rubino and Bev Bellody on revisions to the Local Elderly Tax Relief Program (AKA Ordinance 60). He will meet with Bob Rubino to fine tune any recommended changes to the program and meet with the software vendor to ensure capabilities.

Town Projects

- The Building Department is busy with issuing permits and performing inspections
 - The department has been extraordinarily busy, compared to past years.
 - Daily interaction with various departments to better the Town, as a whole.
 - Answered counter and phone questions from residents, contractors and realtors.
 - Every effort is made to provide the highest level of customer service.
 - Much time is spent on crumbling concrete foundation concerns.
- Crumbling foundation replacement permits issued this month: 5.
- Calls from Fire Department/Emergency: 1 after hours; 2 total.
- Work without permits: 1 cited – full compliance achieved.
- Participated in Development and Staff meetings.
- Participated in numerous discussions regarding blighted properties and junk cars
 - Building Official is the Blight Enforcement Officer.
 - Received 0 blight complaints.
 - Made 3 site visits.
- Attended continuing education classes, as required by State Statute.
- Building Department is the primary contact for all Special Event Permits
 - 1 Special Event permit processed.
- Assisted the Zoning Enforcement Officer with field inspections.
- Building Official and his staff spend significant time with potentially crumbling foundations
 - Building Official continues to work with CRCOG to pre-vet vendors and contractors and refine best-practices to repair crumbling foundations.
- Building Department Permit Technician assists other departments on an as-needed basis.
- Building Official attended Fire Station pre-development meeting.
- Building Official attended Jail Museum repair/rebuild meeting.

Commercial

- Consultation, plan review and inspection with the Fire Marshal regarding:
 - All commercial new construction and remodeling.
 - Commercial Certificate of Occupancies.
 - Change of use requests.
 - Special Event permits.
- Conducted numerous inspections with Fire Marshal DaBica, utilizing a “team approach” to better obtain compliance and enforce life-safety codes and regulations.

Collector of Revenue – 860-871-3651

Total Revenue Collections for the current year from July 1, 2021 through April 30, 2022 are \$47,595,812 or 98.83% of the actual Total Collectible amount. This is in line with last year’s collection rate of 98.03%.

Warrants for delinquent Personal Property and Motor Vehicle bills were given to State Marshal Tim Poloski and he mailed his letters on May 2, 2022. This is at no cost to the town; the Marshal charges the taxpayer a 15% fee with a minimum of \$30.00. Intent to Lien letters were mailed to all delinquent 2020 Grand List Real Estate accounts. Liens will be filed with the Town Clerk on the land records at the end of May.

Finance – 860-871-3653

The Finance Department has received the first payment for the Nip bottle tax in the amount of \$7,000. The payments are disbursed twice a year in April and October from wholesale distributors. The Temporary Town Manager will be working on a proposal for an appropriate use of the funds in accordance to published guidance from the State.

The Finance Department is completing work with the Department Heads for year-end projections and purchases.

The Annual Budget Presentation Meeting was held on April 18th. The Budget Referendum was held on May 3rd. The budget failed to pass the referendum. This Department will now focus on making additional spending cuts for a new budget.

The Finance Department is now starting to gear up for the year-end closing cycle.

Tolland residents may contact Human Services at 860-871-3648 to schedule an appointment to apply for energy assistance.

- **Renters Rebate Program** - Renters 65+, or over 18 and receiving Social Security Disability, who currently reside in Tolland, may be eligible for a “rebate”. This income-based program provides a one-time yearly payment to renters based on their income, rent, and utilities paid in

the previous year (2021). Applicants must have resided in Connecticut for one year prior to filing. Income from all sources not to exceed \$38,100 (single) \$46,400 (married). Applications are accepted by appointment only from April 1 – October 1, 2022. Please contact Jeanne Pitney, Case Manager @ 860-871-3615 for more information.

- **Tolland Food Bank** – If you are a Tolland resident and your household would benefit from using the Food Bank, please contact 860-871-3615. Distribution is by appointment only, and participation is strictly confidential.
- **FoodShare Mobile Food Pantry** – *distribution dates May 5 & 19.*

The following information and ongoing programs/services are also available through the Human Services Department:

- Crisis counseling and Case management.
- Review of residents' Medicare eligibility/options.
- The Tolland Youth Service Bureau manages a Juvenile Review Board (JRB) for young people who might otherwise be referred to the Juvenile Court for low level offenses. The JRB is comprised of volunteers from local and state agencies who are committed to trauma informed, culturally sensitive restorative justice practices. By participating in the JRB, young people are given the opportunity to avoid a court referral, while still being held accountable for their behavior.
- Housing Rehab Program & Fair Housing – Town contact is Beverly Bellody.
- Medicare – Human Services will continue to assist residents as they become eligible for Medicare throughout the year to identify their options for health insurance coverage. For questions or to schedule an appointment with a Certified CHOICES (Connecticut's Programs for Health and Outreach Information, Insurance Assistance and Referral Counseling and Eligibility Screening)/SHIP (State Health Insurance Assistance Programs) Counselor, contact Human Services, at 860-871-3615.

Fair Housing Notice

Beverly Bellody, Director of Tolland Human Services, serves as the Fair Housing Officer for the Town of Tolland. The Federal Fair Housing Act prohibits discrimination in the sale, rental and financing of dwellings, and in other housing-related transactions, based on race, color, national origin, sex, religion, familial status or the presence of children, or disability.

Under the Connecticut Fair Housing Act, it is against the law to deny anyone housing based on race, color, national origin, ancestry, sex, religion, familial status or the presence of children, disability, marital status, sexual orientation, age (except minors), lawful source of income, veteran status or gender identity or expression. Children's/Young Adult Happenings

April's "Library Tech Expo" was a great success. Patrons have been consistently utilizing the equipment within the David Golden Discovery Center ever since the event. Awareness of what the library offers has clearly risen in the past few weeks.

The month of May will feature a variety of fun and exciting programs for kids and teens of all ages. The library will host special events (e.g. scavenger hunts, giveaways, and an escape room) in celebration of “Star Wars Day” and “Free Comic Book Day.” The library will also welcome professional cartoonist, Matt Ryan. Mr. Ryan will conduct a special drawing workshop for pre-teens and teens on May 14th. Additionally, popular recurring story times and clubs will continue.

Summer is approaching and plenty of new, old and exciting events are on the horizon. A new and improved version of “1,000 Books Before Kindergarten” will launch alongside the upcoming 2022 Summer Reading Program. Truck Day will return, the library will welcome Birch Grove’s first-graders for their annual field trip, and the library will work in partnership with several local organizations (e.g. churches, schools, the FRC, and the Local Prevention Council) throughout the summer.

Planning & Development – 860-871-3601

- The Santini Fieldstone Commons application was approved by PZC and Inland Wetlands.
- Planning and Zoning has a public hearing on May 9th to extend the effective date of the affordable housing provisions to January 1, 2023.
- The May 9th public hearing will also revise the drive-thru regulations to allow for drive-thrus in the TVA and CCZ and modify the distance requirements for Drive Thru menu boards.
- Planning and Zoning is beginning the process of revising the Town’s sign regulations.
- The consulting forester for the select timber harvest study met with the Conservation Commission to go over preliminary findings.
- The consulting landscape architect for the Tolland Green Sidewalk Accessibility Study met with the Commission on People with Disabilities and the Historic District Commission. The next step is to meet with those two Commissions and Town Council in a joint meeting on June 29th to discuss final design options.
- The Agriculture Commission is discussing a possible Farm-to-Table dinner to be held in the fall and is looking at recommendations for regulation modifications to clearly allow for farm-related activities (e.g. hay rides, Farm-to-Table dinners, petting zoos, etc.) on farms in Tolland.
- The 4-Town Economic Development Plan Steering Committee hosted a joint event with UConn to help familiarize local small businesses with job placement.
- The 4-Town Economic Development Plan Steering Committee is still looking for a possible intern to provide implementation assistance in the fall.
- Continuing zoning enforcement efforts regarding complaints primarily related to roosters, erosion and sediment, and drainage issues.

Public Safety – 860-871-3677

- Public Safety Officers participated in school fire and lockdown drills throughout the month.
- Captain Dennis Carlson attended several I-Lead training classes.
- Several Public Safety Officers, led by PSO Trevor Gantick, conducted Heartsaver® CPR/AED training for 17 Town employees (6 from Parks & Facilities, 6 from Public Works and 5 from Town Hall). The Heartsaver® course level teaches participants skills to provide CPR and use an

AED in a timely, effective manner as a single rescuer. All participants were trained on Adult CPR with AED, Infant CPR as well as how to relieve choking in adults and infants.

- Annual Hose, Hard Suction, Nozzle and Ladder Testing was held on April 11th & 12th.
- Annual Fire Extinguisher Testing was held on April 18th.
- Annual Hurst Tool Testing was held on April 25th.
- Annual DOT Chassis Inspections continued throughout the month.

Animal Control

In the month of April 2022, the Animal Control Department answered 40 calls/complaints during regular & after work hours.

- The Town of Tolland Animal Control Facebook Page has 4,422 “followers”.
- Officers continue to patrol parks and trail systems for off leash dogs.
- Officers continue to assist with several sick/injured/trapped wildlife calls. No humans or domestic animals had direct exposure and therefore no rabies tests were performed.
- All roaming dogs that were impounded were successfully returned to their families.
- Officers rehomed an 8 year old, male, Labrador Mix that was surrendered by his owner.
- Officers impounded a cat with her 5 kittens. All will be available for adoption once the kittens are 8 weeks of age.
- Officers continue to assist the Town of Hebron/CT Department of Agriculture with the care of three dogs and a cat that were seized during a large-scale animal cruelty case in their town.
- Officers continue to work with the Public Safety Department on the SOG’s and executive orders in regards to the COVID-19 Pandemic.
- Officers continue to assist various other agencies (CT State Police/CT Environmental Conservation Officers/CT State Marshal’s/Tolland Fire Department) with cases/scenes they have in which animals are involved.
- The Annual Rabies Vaccination Clinic will be held drive-thru style on July 2, 2022, 10:00 am to noon at Tolland High School.

- Emergency Management Director John Littell closely monitors all State WebEOC communications, information and weather-related advisories during the month. Advisory bulletins are redistributed to appropriate personnel.
- A monetary donation to benefit the CERT team was received from a resident. The funds have been deposited into the CERT Team's account and the private donor was thanked for their thoughtfulness and generosity.
- On April 28th, Director Littell virtually attended a Capitol Region Emergency Planning Council meeting.

Fire Marshal

- Propane tank installation plans and inspections.
- Review and approval of permits.
- Information sharing with insurance companies and realty companies referencing fire suppression capabilities and underground water supply capabilities.

- Completed assignments as directed by management.
- Assist Fire Department while short on staff.
- Investigated fires and alarms as required.
- Answered several overnight off-hour phone calls for various problems including: Fire Alarms, CO detection, Smoke detection, Fire Alarm issues for residents, etc.
- Assisted Director of Public Safety as requested.
- Approved change of use occupancies.
- Inspecting business occupancies.
- Inspecting Ivy Woods Apartment Complex.
- Reviewing prints for fire code compliance new and renovated buildings and projects.
- Working with homeowners to eliminate dangerous accumulation of clutter.
- Inspected day care facilities.
- Attended school fire drills, and Building Safety and Security Meetings.
- Oversight to ensure emergency access is maintained during renovations at The Quarry Campground.
- Monitoring installation of compliant Fire Alarm System at Old Post Village.
- Attended training to ensure certification hours are available.
- Worked with DEEP and ESI to find a source of oil leak in storm drains.

Fire Department

- The Department monitors and disseminates information and protocols regarding the Coronavirus pandemic from the CDC.

- Our Infection Control Officers monitor PPE requirements and provide updates as necessary in accordance with CDC guidelines.
- First Responders continue to face an enhanced risk of exposure to COVID-19 and its variants. Both career and volunteer staff provide patients with exceptional care while facing the risk and uncertainty of COVID-19.
- The Department’s PEER team continues to promote EAP programs and provide support and resources to all members.
- This month’s in-service drills included training on the LUCAS device, completing SCBA fit testing and FAST Board operations.
- The Fire Police Unit responds to calls to provide traffic control and scene security and safety.
- Members of the Fire Police Unit met and had a roundtable discussion of the pros, cons, strengths and weaknesses of previous calls. Member’s gear was checked for serviceability.
- Some Fire Police Unit Members were in attendance at both the Tri-County Fire Police Association’s and State Fire Police Association’s monthly meetings.

Public Works – 860-871-3696

Paving/Overlay Program – This year’s streets to be resurfaced are Bakos Road, South River Road from south of Woodhenge Drive to the Willimantic River, Cook Road, Goose Lane, Sand Hill and Ryan Road. This project is expected to begin in mid-July.

Parks & Facilities – Our crews are busy readying our athletic fields for springtime playing with weekly mowing, line painting and constant grooming of the playing surfaces. Please remember to utilize our trash receptacles to help keep our Parks beautiful.

Highway Division – The crews have been busy with tree trimming, patching of roadways and re-grading of our unimproved gravel roads. We are also getting ready for the upcoming paving season along with doing some street sweeping. Thank you for your patience during our busy construction season.

Cemetery Division – There have been seven burials so far this year. A local Vendor has been awarded the Neglected Cemetery Grant project. Preliminary work on this project has begun and should be wrapped up by the summer of 2022. We are concentrating on East Cemetery for the improvements

WPCA – All five pump stations are working as designed. We have installed back up alarm systems in the Old Post Pump Station and at the Pump Station at the High School, which run off cellular service as a secondary notification system in case we lose the use of the phone line. New bollards with NO PARKING signs have been installed at the Old Post Pump Station as numerous vehicles have been parking there while waiting to pick up their children from TIS.

Once again, as the Director of Public Works, I would like to thank the Public Works employees for their continued dedication to helping us get through these difficult times, thank you.

Recreation – 860-871-3610

The Recreation Department is gearing up for its' busy season. We are currently planning, hiring, and organizing for summer camp, youth sports, youth programs, and adult programming. Summer camp registration is ongoing. Program enrollment so far has been very promising.

Our adult softball leagues will be starting this month. Games are played at Crandall's Park Tuesday-Friday. We have ten teams this year.

We started a soccer program for children ages 2-4. The program is Soccer Shots and it runs on Saturday mornings at the Recreation Department's fields. The program filled within two days of being open.

The Pavilion is open and available for rental.

Cross Farms Concession stand has opened for the season.

The Lodge rentals continue to stay busy.
