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SPECIAL MEETING MINUTES ARPA SUB-COMMITTEE - ZOOM MEETING December 28, 2022 – 5:00 P.M.

1. **CALL TO ORDER**: Colleen Yudichak called the meeting to order at 5 PM.

2. PUBLIC COMMENTS

None.

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A. October 27, 2022 – Regular Meeting

L. Hancock motioned to approve the minutes of the October 27, 2022 meeting.

VC Nuccio seconded the motion.

Discussion: none

Motion passed unanimously.

4. OLD BUSINESS - ACTION/DISCUSSION ITEMS.

4.1 B. Foley updated the committee on the status of the soccer fields. L. Hancock advised that Public Works Director has advised that the materials have been purchased and the underdrainage will be installed as weather permits.

5. **NEW BUSINESS - ACTION/DISCUSSION ITEMS.**

- 5.1 L. Hancock discussed the request spreadsheet for items added for the FY23-24 Capital Improvement Plan requests. The following items are being requested for the Sub-committee to recommend to the Town Council as part of the CIP Plan funding (\$789,000):
 - a. Two heavy-duty plow/dump trucks for plowing and parks maintenance \$295,000 each \$590,000.
 - 1) L. Hancock discussed the CIP plan and the status of the trucks to be replaced. She shared photos of the two trucks with the extensive undercarriage and body rust. VC Nuccio shared concern for the actual need for these vehicles to be replaced. B. Foley supports the future replacement of the Heavy Duty dump trucks that are used to plow the streets. He does want to hire a consultant to evaluate the Public Works operations and fleet to ensure that the staffing, operations, the replacement schedules and fleet are at the correct levels. VC Nuccio is not comfortable in recommending funding for this until it can be confirmed that it is needed. L. Hancock explained that this process is to provide a recommendation for funding only if it is included in the Capital Improvement Plan and approved by the Town Council and budget referendum process. It is not recommending the purchase at this time. VC Nuccio would prefer to wait to proceed on this until January when the Town Manager can provide additional information.
 - b. TIS & TMS Seclusion Room Special Education required updates \$58,000.
 - 1) B. Foley explained the needs for the BOE special education seclusion areas and supports the need to provide safety for the children and their needs. VC. Nuccio questioned as to why this is being requested since there were already renovations to the special education areas a couple of years ago. B. Foley was unable to comment on the prior work that was completed but advised that he toured the areas with Dr. Willett and confirmed the need.

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- c. TIS Nurses Area Addition/Renovation \$41,000.
 - 1) L. Hancock and B. Foley explained the needs in the nurses area to provide privacy and quarantine areas when evaluating and treating patients.
- d. Jail Museum ADA renovations \$100,000.
 - 1) L. Hancock discussed the accessibility and safety needs of the Jail Museum. Town staff and the Town Engineer reviewed the facility to confirm that renovations are needed. The Town has been approved for a \$20,000 SHPO grant to do design work. There isn't an actual cost identified at this time but it was estimated that it could be up to \$100,000, so that amount was being recommended as a placeholder. The Town could apply for a future SHPO grant to perform the work at a 50% cost-share. ARPA funds in that case would not be able to be used to cover the Town's 50% share. If the Town does not receive a SHPO grant then the ARPA funds could be used. VC Nuccio feels that since we do not have an actual cost for this that it should not be recommended at this time.
- e. Athletic Turf Field \$829,000.
 - 1) L. Hancock advised that this item is currently in the CIP plan under recommended bond and LoCIP funding. She suggested that depending on which direction that the Council wants to proceed, that this could possibly be paid for with ARPA funds rather than Debt and LoCIP. The LoCIP funds could be reallocated to paving since the ARPA and LoCIP grants cannot be used as combined funding. VC Nuccio expressed that she is not confident in the recommendation that it needs to be replaced provided by two vendors who perform the actual type of installation. B. Foley advised that he will meet with Peter Sztaba and the Athletic Director at the School to go look at the turf and discuss it with them.

C. Yudichak summarized that the projects that the committee is approving to go forward with are the special education seclusion area, the nurse's addition/renovation and the Jail Museum. The committee will revisit the trucks and the artificial turf at the next meeting. VC. Nuccio wants to delay inclusion of the Jail Museum funding until an actual cost estimate is determined and push it out to year two in the CIP plan.

VC. Nuccio motioned that the BOE Special Education Seclusion rooms and the Nurses area addition/renovation have ARPA funding allocated for those projects. Seconded by B. Foley. Motion carried unanimously.

The committee would also like an update on the cost for the pickleball courts from Bruce Watt and to also remove the dial a ride additional funding from the list since it has been confirmed by B. Bellody that it is not required.

6. ADJOURNMENT

B. Foley motioned to adjourn the meeting at 6:22 PM.

VC Nuccio seconded the motion.
