# TOLLAND TOWN COUNCIL – ARPA SUBCOMMITTEE MINUTES ZOOM ONLY – SPECIAL MEETING August 31, 2022 – 4:30 P.M.

Committee Members present: Colleen Yudichak, Chair (C); Tammy Nuccio, Vice Chair (VC); Brian Foley, Town Manager; Lisa Hancock, Secretary

**Others present:** Beverly Bellody, Human Services Director; Mike Wilkinson, Director of Administrative Services; Bruce Watt, Recreation Director.

#### 1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 4:30 PM by C. Yudichak

#### 2. Public Comment

There was no public comment.

#### 3. Approval Of Minutes

VC. Nuccio motioned to approve the Meeting Minutes of July 27, 2022. Seconded by Lisa Hancock. Motion carried unanimously.

#### 4. Old Business – Action/Discussion Items

- 4.1 The subcommittee discussed potential funding for recreation program fees free or reduced fee recreational programs. Bruce Watt shared information regarding the historical cost of the various recreation programs. VC Nuccio suggested the idea of not providing the funding for all programs but maybe only the adult and youth and preschool programs excluding the pre-school class. Bruce Watt recommended offering reduced fee programs in order for there to be some ownership by the participants. This will help ensure that full participation in the classes. VC Nuccio requested that this topic added to the September ARPA Subcommittee agenda to discuss if this will move forward. VC Nuccio suggested that funding would be \$100,000 each for two years. Beverly Bellody questioned whether paying for vendors would trigger prevailing wage requirements. Lisa Hancock said that it would not because the funding would be a subsidization payment for the participation and not for the vendors directly. VC Nuccio motioned to table the item. Seconded by Brian Foley. Motion carried.
- 4.2 Lisa Hancock provided an update for Crack repair at Old Cathole Road Tennis Courts.

  ARPA funding may not be used for this project if we were to be to be awarded the STEAP funds for the remainder of the tennis court renovations. We have not heard if

- the STEAP grant will be awarded yet. VC Nuccio would like to leave this on the list for now until we hear about the STEAP grant.
- 4.3 Lisa Hancock provided an update for drainage concerns at Cross Farms soccer field The Town Engineer reviewed the site and met with Scott Lappen and Bruce Watt to discuss the concerns. The Town Engineer provided a cost estimate to address the drainage issue and also an estimate to replace the entire field. It is not necessary to replace the entire field. The areas of concern are the lower soccer field and back right corner of the upper field. Brian would like to discuss this further with Scott Lappen to make sure that we will spend funds appropriately. The Subcommittee would like to invite Scott Lappen to the next meeting for further discussion. Brian Foley motioned to table this item until the next meeting. Seconded by VC Nuccio. Motioned carried.

#### 5. New Business

- 5.1 Mike Wilkinson discussed the request for the \$100,000 funding for the Bulky Waste and recycling needs. He provided background on how the initial fund was created in order to reserve funds to replace recycling bins in the future. It was determined during prior year's budget process that there would not be a need to replace these bins and that the funds would be better used to cover the interim impact of the recycling costs and one free bulky waste removal event. The payment for recycling is beginning to reduce the cost to the Town and depending on a future contract renewal, it might become affordable to be included within the budget for the future. The cost for the recycling can be between \$60,000 \$80,000 depending on the contract terms. The one free bulky waste event costs between \$16,000 \$20,000. VC Nuccio is not in favor of using one time revenue for ongoing expenditures and that we will need to eventually budget the full cost into the operating budget. She would like to move this item to the bottom of the list for now and revisit it in the future during the budget process.
- 5.2 The Subcommittee discussed Mr. Tim Griffin's Email attachment from May 20, 2022. Lisa Hancock provided the background regarding the original request. It was partially reactionary to the funding for the Miracle Field. Brian Foley is going to reach out to Mr. Griffin to determine if this is still a request. If it is still a request then he will ask them to prioritize the various items on the list. The Subcommittee has a concern that if this is considered then other sports teams may also desire funding and there may not be sufficient funding to provide equitable resources to all the teams. Lisa Hancock motioned to table this item to the next meeting after Brian Foley has had an opportunity to speak to Mr. Griffin. Seconded by Brian Foley. Motion carried unanimously.

5.3 A new item added to the request spreadsheet was discussed. It was concerning an email request from Mr. Art Jones for splash pad and other improvements at Crandall Park. The Subcommittee felt that this item would need extensive research regarding location, cost estimates, water sources, staffing and other future operating costs. VC Nuccio feels that this should be vetted completely prior to any recommendation. Lisa Hancock suggested that it could possibly be included as part of the Capital Improvement Program. It could then be determined if ARPA can fund it. Brian Foley would like to explore the idea.

#### 6. Adjournment

VC Nuccio motioned for Adjournment at 6 PM. Seconded by Lisa Hancock. Motion carried unanimously.
