July 27, 2022 – 4:30 P.M.

Committee Members present: Colleen Yudichak, Chair; Tammy Nuccio, Vice Chair; Brian Foley, Town Manager; Lisa Hancock, Secretary

Others present: Beverly Bellody, Human Services Director; Maureen Flanagan, Asst. Human Services Director; Bruce Watt, Recreation Director.

- 1. Call to Order
 - a. Chairperson Yudichak called the meeting to order at 4:33 PM.
- 2. Public Comment None
- 3. Introduction of new subcommittee member, Town Manager, Brian Foley
 - a. Chairperson Yudichak introduced the new Town Manager, Brian Foley and welcomed him.
- 4. Approval Of Minutes
 - 4.1 Meeting Minutes of <u>June 23, 2022.</u> Vice Chair Nuccio motioned to approve the minutes. Seconded by Lisa Hancock. Motion approved unanimously.
- 5. Old Business Action/Discussion Items
 - 5.1 Resolution to recommend to Town Council the approval for up to \$10,000 for consulting services as requested by the Tolland Mental Health and Substance Abuse Committee.

Maureen Flanagan, Asst. Human Services Director discussed the proposal provided to the Mental Health Task Force for consultant services from B. Weyland Smith. She reviewed the details of the contract and provided a written summary, which are attached to these minutes.

V.C. Nuccio motioned to recommend to Town Council the approval for up to \$10,000 for consulting services as requested by the Tolland Mental Health and Substance Abuse Committee. Seconded by L. Hancock. Motion approved unanimously.

5.2 Discussion and potential resolution to recommend to the Town Council the approval of funds for recreation program fees free or reduced fee recreational programs. Amount to be determined at the meeting up to \$20,000.

Recreation Director, Bruce Watt, attended to discuss V.C. Nuccio's request for free or reduced fee recreational programs be funded by ARPA. She would like to try to provide programs for a year but needs an estimated analysis of what the potential cost may be. Mr. Watt discussed historical program revenues/costs and provided some background on some of the types of programs that could be or have been offered. V.C. Nuccio requested Mr. Watt to provide a proposal for programs that could be funded. Mr. Watt will attend a special meeting of the ARPA Subcommittee on August 31, 2022 at 4:30 PM. The meeting on August 25, 2022 was cancelled.

No action on this item was taken.

Item 5.10 was taken out of order so Mr. Watt may provide additional information. Discussion and potential resolution to recommend to the Town Council the approval funds for Crack repair at Old Cathole Road Tennis Courts for \$82,000. (FY 22-23 CIP – CNRE \$40,000 and Rec Fund \$42,000). Mr. Watt provided an update regarding the Old Cathole Road Tennis Courts. The Town is seeking a \$500,000 STEAP grant to address the other tennis courts at Cross Farms. This grant requests a partial share of town funding in addition to the grant amount. L. Hancock stated that the Town has requested the State of CT if this CIP project for \$82,000 may be used to meet that requirement. We are awaiting a response. We are also trying to determine if we use ARPA funding for the \$82,000 if that would become an issue for obtaining the STEAP funding. This item was tabled until the information can be determined.

5.3 Discussion and potential resolution to recommend to the Town Council the approval of funds for the Cross Farms ADA Pathway project \$200,000. (FY 22-23 CIP DEBT \$191,878). L. Hancock discussed reallocating ARPA funds for the current year CIP Debt in order to reduce the amount of debt burden on the Town. She advised that this would be permissible under the current bonding resolution due to the fact that the bond must be offset by any grants. This will completely offset the bonding amount. She also advised that this is the same reasoning for items 5.4 and 5.5. V.C. Nuccio motioned to recommend to the

- Town Council the approval of funds for the Cross Farms ADA Pathway project \$200,000. Second by C. Yudichak. Motion carried unanimously.
- 5.4 V.C. Nuccio motioned to recommend to the Town Council the approval funds for the TORO Mower \$115,488. (FY 22-23 CIP DEBT). Seconded by L. Hancock. Motion carried unanimously.
- 5.5 V.C. Nuccio motioned to recommend to the Town Council the approval funds for the TMS Track Resurface \$140,000. (FY 22-23 CIP DEBT). Seconded by L. Hancock. Motion carried unanimously.
- 5.6 V.C. Nuccio motioned to recommend to the Town Council the approval funds for a Tractor for the Board of Education (BOE) for \$24,000. (CNRE). Seconded by L. Hancock. Motion carried unanimously.
- 5.7 V.C. Nuccio motioned to recommend to the Town Council the approval funds for Floor Machines for the BOE for \$24,000. (CNRE). Seconded by L. Hancock. Motion carried unanimously.
- 5.8 V.C. Nuccio motioned to recommend to the Town Council the approval funds for a Dishwasher & Sink System for \$45,000. (CNRE \$40,000). Seconded by L. Hancock. Motion carried unanimously.
- 5.9 Discussion and potential resolution to recommend to the Town Council the approval funds for a Heavy Duty Dump/Snow Plow Truck for \$225,000. (Yr. 2 CIP DEBT \$198,000). The committee discussed this item and decided to hold off on this until the end of the year when the purchase would be closer to year 2 of the program.
- 5.10 Discussed earlier.
- 5.11 L. Hancock provided an overview of the ARPA spreadsheet. The subcommittee would like to have Mike Wilkinson attend the 8/31 special meeting to discuss the reimbursement of the free bulky waste funds. There was also a request for Scott Lappen to

provide an update on the issue with the Cross Farms soccer field, water issue and provide any information for funding needs to correct the problem. The email from Tim Griffin was discussed and the committee would like to review it again at the next meeting.

6. Adjournment – V.C. Nuccio motioned to adjourn at 6:29 PM. Seconded by C. Yudichak. Motion carried unanimously.

This concern was brought to our attention by Dave Garritt, President of Tolland Soccer Club, you were on the original email dated 5/22/22. At that point, we discussed this and we engaged with the Town Engineer to look into what was installed for drainage and what is contributing to the issue along with devising a plan (estimate) for how to correct, if possible, the issue. Initially there were many emails back and forth between Chuck and I beginning on May 23, 2022. Chuck asked what direction we were looking to go in and I expressed that at that time we were looking for more of an

investigative report on his findings and what the design and construction cost may be. On June 15, 2022, I asked Chuck for an update for you and the Town Council. Chuck said that he was planning a visit to the field on June 22, 2022 for the ADA concerns. Chuck reached out to you and Bev on June 17, 2022 stating that working with the Girl Scouts on their ADA project would push his visit out another week, which both you and Bev were agreeable with. Scope of Services

Phase I: Site Investigation

The Town of Tolland anticipates investigating and correcting drainage issues at the lower and upper soccer fields at the Cross Farm Athletic Complex. These fields currently experience wet conditions that decrease the play time and quality of the fields. CHA will coordinate with the Tolland Department of Public Works to conduct test pits and obtain soil samples. CHA will test the soils to determine their drainage characteristics.

Deliverables:

- Soil testing (test pits to be excavated by DPW)
- PDF record of soil characteristics

Phase II: Design Plans

Based on the soil testing results and field inspections, CHA will prepare design plans and an estimated probable cost to remediate the drainage concerns at the lower and upper Cross Farm soccer fields.

Deliverables:

- PDF of design plans
- PDF of Estimated Probable Cost

Assumptions & Clarifications

- No Permitting, including local, State, or DOT, will be required as part of this scope of work.
- Lab work for soil analysis is included in the scope and fee.
- Design plans shall be limited to construction plans. Bidding documents and technical specifications can be provided under a separate scope and fee.
- Professional representation at meetings (not anticipated), will be invoiced as additional hourly.
- Construction inspection and administration (not anticipated) can be provided under a separate scope and fee.
- Any review, filing, application, or other regulatory fees (Local, State or Federal) will be the responsibility of the Town (not anticipated).

Ideas for Tolland Baseball and Softball Field Improvements (3/2/22)

Fields

- A softball field not on BOE property
- 50/70 baseball or utility field we can use for the Spring season potential to convert
 Lower Crandall to a skin utility field with backstop improvements, multiple base and
 softball pitchers' plate anchors, scoreboard, dugouts, and a small press box. This field may
 be better rotated 90 degrees clockwise, which would require all new fencing.
- Large projects at existing fields
 - Dugouts at Birch Grove and River Park
 - Scorer's boxes/press boxes at Cross C and A from a Klotter shed with multiple windows on the field side and windows and a door on the shed side
 - Scoreboards at additional fields
 - Additional bleachers
 - Windscreen on fences, especially at Cross C
 - Pave the path at Cross Farms should be done for a true ADA walkway too
 - Level dugouts and benches at Birch Grove
- Smaller projects at existing fields
 - Move the Cross A shed behind the bushes behind home plate to open up the spectator area
 - Double barrel bull pens on RF side of Cross C and beyond Cross A outfield fence with Cross
 A fencing to potentially support a plyo wall. A gate would be required for pitchers to
 access the field for both fields.
 - When THS field turf is replaced, it would be great to use strips of that in every bullpen and every batting cage.
 - Concrete throwing wall
 - Break away bases where needed and replacement of worn ones
 - Water hose and quality hose reels at all fields that have water access
 - Clay bricks for mounds and maybe batter's boxes
 - RP1 mound rebuild similar to what we did for RP2 a couple of years ago
 - · Heavy tarps and weights/tires for mounds and batter's boxes
 - Backstop improvements with black out
 - Netting solution for foul balls for lighted Crandall field backstop
 - Gravel in dugouts and from the dugouts to on deck circle and/or path towards home plate (always site of the deepest puddles). Cross A has this and is perfect now.
 - AEDs
- Signs

- Easy to mount brackets for sponsor signs from PT wood, galvanized wire, or a commercial solution
- Similar to when Legion did way back when, convert banners to metal signs of district/regional championships and hang them at Cross C
- Small signs for fan control "No One Going Pro," "Your Kids are Watching," etc.
